"The only constant in life is change." This is a quote by Heraclitis of Ephesus who was a Greek philosopher and I can't think of a more appropriate statement for this Advent season. Our Large Print Operation

-Annual Report-

Since moving from Braille to our Large Print operation last February, things have been going well.

We have a dedicated core of about 12 people, not all of whom participate in our LP operation at each session. Due to our new commercial type printer which we run by computer, we have become proficient to the point where we meet every other week. We print in an eighteen point font. We are meeting on Mondays and Tuesdays, usually each day for a little over an hour. One may ask why meet two days during a week when the same amount of work could be turned out by working on one day a week. The simple answer is that we enjoy the fellowship and the task is more enjoyable since we don't have the pressure atmosphere we had when it took 3 people just to operate our Braille press. We currently print about 70 books a month and ship 30 cartons of books each month. Each box usually contains two books: The Old Testament books of Joshua and the combined books of Judges and Ruth. Ninety five percent of our shipments are addressed to domestic address and the rest are sent to countries in Africa and Asia. We continually hear of the appreciation of our work by people who never before could read The Bible and learn about Jesus. It's an enjoyable experience for us, too. If you know someone who would like a large print book or books of the Bible, we can arrange it for them.

The CNH District Mission Grant Goal for 2014-2016 is \$125,000 with a total Mission G o a l o f \$250,000. Of the

20 Mission Grants for the biennium, 6 have been funded and we are currently partially funded on #7-Safe Place to Play for Children/Families Outreach Ministry, Hayward.

Thank you to Roger Klaves who continues to raise mites by recycling the plastic, glass and aluminum brought to our monthly meetings.

Guest Speakers at this year's meetings included a continuation of our "We all have a Story" Series with special guests Jan Wade and Susan Stenbeck. Martha Dubke told us about her short-term mission trips to Poland and Jamaica with Pastor Dubke. Another guest speaker was Stephanie Gregorino of SHOR and Dianne Wilkinson for the Deaf Youth Ministry in Texas. Bey Knaak led Bible studies on the "Fruits of the Spirit". We held our September meeting at Feather Canyon Retirement Center where several of our members are residents. In June we went to Anderson to Exodus Farms to hear about their mission of healing broken horses and broken children.

Two workshops were also held to tie lap blankets that were then donated to Valley Oak Children's Services and Torres Community Shelter.

The Phebians continue to be active in the Zone and many attended the Spring Rally in Yuba City and the Fall Rally in Brownsville. The LWML CNH Convention was held at the McClellan Convention Center near Sacramento this year with our Church being well represented. In August our Zone hosted a Mission Festival "Lift High the Cross" at Redeemer Lutheran in Chico. Bible study was led by Pastor Bramwell of Chester and our guest speaker was Lynnette Campbell, LWML CNH President who spoke about the many short-term mission trips she and her husband Kent have participated in through MOST Ministries.

Monthly Human Care ingatherings have included HELP 4 People, Angel Blankets, SHOR, Exodus Farms, Oroville Rescue Mission, Brownsville Church Quilt Guild, Railroad Restoration Group, Westside Domestic Violence Shelter, and cookies for our homebound members.

Other activities include our annual rummage sale which raised over \$3,400 plus matching funds from the Morlock Trust. Proceeds fund our Christmas giving program, the Smiles Luncheon served 63 guests, and the Craft and Bake sale proceeds

of over \$700 goes to Bethesda Lutheran Communities-North California Area.

The Phebians continue to host Victory Celebrations as requested.

Members of Our Savior continue to be active in the LWML on the local, zone and district levels. Jean Orsborn is serving on the Christian Life Committee of the District LWML, and Kathy Richardson is Financial Secretary.

We thank the congregation for their continuing support of our outreach projects.
